

The CACB is the body which assesses all degrees and diplomas in Architecture. You will need to contact the CACB to have your education assessed. This is the first step to licensure.

There is a competency based assessment program for internationally trained architects. The Broadly Experienced Foreign Architects Program (BEFA) includes a self-assessment which can be done before arrival.
